Respected Sir/Madam,

I, Yogesh Chhetri, Son of Late Kushan Chhetri, resident of Niz Gaon Okas Tea P.O. Sonada, P.S. Jorebunglow, Dist. Darjeeling, West Bengal - 734209, do hereby most respectfully, yet firmly, submit this First Information Report bringing to your notice grave and serious offences committed against me, warranting immediate registration of an FIR and prompt legal action.

That on 20th December 2025, between 7:30 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., while I was lawfully riding my motorcycle and proceeding from Matigara towards Rohini for some up of my work, upon reaching Khaprail T.C.P. More, one motorcycle bearing registration number AR-01-C-7479, coming from the opposite direction, was being driven in an extremely rash, reckless, and dangerous manner, without regard for traffic rules or human life. The said motorcycle suddenly entered my lane at high speed and forcefully rammed into my vehicle, as a result of which I was violently thrown onto the road.

Due to the said brutal and negligent act, I sustained serious and grievous injuries, including injuries to my brain, neck, knee, hands, and legs, placing my life in imminent danger. I had to be immediately went to North Bengal Medical College & Hospital, where I taken first medical aid, and even thereafter I have been suffering from severe pain, trauma, and physical limitations. The nature of injuries clearly establishes the criminal negligence and culpable conduct of the rider of the offending vehicle.

It is further stated that after noting the registration number of the offending motorcycle, namely AR-01-C-7479, I verified the vehicle details through the official Government mParivahan application. Shockingly, it was revealed that on the date of the accident, the said vehicle was being illegally plied on public roads, as both its pollution certificate and Fitness status were found to be expired/invalid. The act of driving such a vehicle itself constitutes a serious statutory violation and demonstrates complete disregard for public safety and the rule of law.

More alarmingly, after the said incident, one person named Aditya S Kumar as shown in true caller from the opposite side involved in the accident, acting with criminal intent, has been continuously threatening me over phone calls from various number bearing no. 89218-92479, 82505-37922, 62842-46627. The said person is illegally demanding money from me and has categorically threatened me in explicit terms. The caller further threatened me in clear and unequivocal terms stating that I will put the patient to eternal sleep for his entire life if I do not receive the money for the hospital bill, thereby issuing a direct and deliberate threat to kill, these threats are not casual or vague but direct, repeated, and life-endangering, causing me extreme fear, mental agony, and a constant apprehension of serious harm or death.

The conduct of the accused persons clearly discloses the commission of serious cognizable offences, including but not limited to rash and criminally negligent driving causing grievous injuries, operating an uninsured and non-compliant vehicle on a public road, criminal intimidation, and threats to life. The acts are deliberate, unlawful, and designed to terrorize, extort, and silence me.

Any delay in taking action may result in further harm to me and would embolden the accused persons to carry out their criminal threats.

In view of the above grave facts involving grievous injuries, blatant statutory violations, and explicit death threats, I most respectfully request immediate registration of the FIR, prompt arrest of the accused persons, and initiation of strict legal action to safeguard my life and uphold the rule of law.

The delay of about five to six days in lodging this FIR occurred due to my hospitalization and subsequent medical advice for complete bed rest, which made it physically impossible for me to approach the police earlier. I am ready and willing to cooperate fully with the investigation and to produce all medical records, vehicle details, and other documents as required.
