Respected Sir/Madam,

I, Anisha Saha, Daughter of Abhilash Gobinda Saha, wife of Subhendu Basak, House wife by profession, Resident of APC Sarani, Ward No. 39, Haidarpara, P.O. Haidarpara, P.S. Bhaktinagar, District - Jalpaiguri, PIN - 734006 most respectfully beg to state as follows:

That my marriage with accused No. 1, Subhendu Basak, was registered on 05.11.2024 under the Special Marriage Act, 1954, bearing Certificate No. WB32800102020600202892-2024-140400, and was subsequently solemnized on 24.01.2025 as per Hindu rites and customs at Swarnali Bhawan, Haidarpara, District Jalpaiguri.

That after marriage, I started residing at my matrimonial home situated at Basak Villa, Itahar, Uttar Dinajpur, with my husband and mother-in-law (accused No. 2).

That from the very beginning of my matrimonial life, my mother-in-law, Sujala Basak, displayed strong dislike towards me and started subjecting me to continuous mental and physical cruelty. She used to abuse me on trivial matters, insult me regularly, and deliberately prevent me from performing household duties, especially cooking, by constantly finding faults.

That despite my sincere efforts to adjust and maintain peace, the accused persons continued to torture me. Initially, my husband supported me, but later he stopped intervening and became indifferent.

That on 05.06.2025, my mother-in-law entered our room, assaulted my husband, and verbally abused him. When I tried to intervene, she physically

assaulted me by pulling my hair and beating me. Following this incident, local neighbours and members of the Panchayat intervened and warned her, and a separate arrangement for cooking was made.

That the accused persons continuously humiliated me for my complexion and body, using derogatory remarks, and also subjected me to persistent dowry-related harassment. At the time of marriage, my father had already provided furniture, including a wooden bed, colour television, mattress, and other articles worth more than Rs.1,00,000/-.They also demanded dowry of Rupees 2 lakh at the time of marriage, But my father was unable to provide the money.

That during my pregnancy, the behaviour of my husband also changed drastically. He started demanding money from my parental home for trivial matters. Under pressure and helplessness, I was forced to seek financial assistance from my father.

That my mother-in-law was unhappy about my pregnancy and even attempted to harm me and my unborn child by intentionally spilling water on the floor, causing me to slip. Fortunately, no severe injury occurred, but I had to consult a doctor on 04.08.2025 due to fear and trauma.

That despite such serious incidents, my husband restrained me from approaching the police and failed to provide any emotional or financial support. Instead, he continued demanding money.

That later, I was sent to my parental home in Siliguri and was forced to remain there during my pregnancy, with all medical and delivery expenses borne by my father.

That I gave birth to a female child on 06.11.2025 at Basus Clinic Health Care Pvt. Ltd., Siliguri. Shockingly, my husband came to visit us and none of the persons from my in law's family visited me or the newborn child at the hospital, nor did they provide any financial support.

That after repeated requests, my husband eventually took me back to the matrimonial home, but his attitude remained unwilling and hostile, as his mother openly expressed her dislike towards me and my daughter.

That in the meantime, my minor daughter became seriously ill, and I had to take her to Kolkata for medical treatment. All the expenses for such treatment were borne by my father, as my husband and in-laws failed and neglected to provide any financial support.

That after returning from Kolkata, on 09.04.2026, I found that the kitchen in my matrimonial home was locked. Upon asking my husband for the key, he informed me that the key was with my mother-in-law. When I approached my mother-in-law and requested the key, she became aggressive and questioned me as to why I needed it. That thereafter, upon accessing the kitchen area, I discovered that several of my Kansa utensils were missing. When I brought this to the notice of my husband, he casually asked his mother about the same, as she had possession of the key.

That suddenly and without any provocation, my mother-in-law became extremely aggressive and assaulted me by slapping me. When I questioned her conduct, she violently caught hold of my neck and started choking me with an intention to cause serious harm, and during such assault, my chain was broken.

That shockingly, my husband did not make any genuine attempt to protect me and only pretended to intervene. Instead of supporting me, he remained passive and indifferent during the assault. That when I attempted to inform the police regarding the said incident, my husband restrained me and prevented me from doing so. The said act amounts to continued physical violence and cruelty upon me.

That thereafter, I was wrongfully confined inside a room by the accused persons. Somehow, I managed to contact my mother over phone and informed her about the entire incident. I was extremely frightened and apprehensive about my life and the safety of my minor child. That after remaining under such fear and mental trauma for 2-3 days, I somehow managed to escape from my matrimonial home. I am presently living under constant fear for my life and the life of my minor daughter, and I have no other alternative but to seek legal protection and justice.

Therefore, I most humbly request your good office to kindly register an FIR against the accused persons and take immediate and strict legal action against them.
