Subject: Complaint regarding Theft by House-Breaking / Criminal Trespass at Industrial Premises — Raj Trading Co., Plot No. 17A & B, Dabgram Industrial Estate, Satellite Township, Fulbari, Siliguri.

Respected Sir/Ma'am.

1. Raj Kumar Jajodia, residing at Parthona Apartment, Shaktigarh Road 1, Siliguri, West Bengal, am a proprietor of Raj Trading Co., situated at Plot No. 17A and B, Dabgram Industrial Estate, Satellite Township, Fulbari, Siliguri — an edible oil packaging and trading unit. I am writing this complaint to bring to your urgent notice the commission of theft by house-breaking at our factory premises, discovered on the morning of 07th May 2026.

2. On 07/05/2026, I arrived at the factory premises at approximately 9:25 A.M. along with my staff member, Shri Sanjeev Kumar Shah. I handed over the keys to Shri Sanjeev to open the main gate. As we entered the premises, we immediately noticed that one of the iron gates adjacent to the main gate was found open, and the lock securing it was lying broken on the floor. The said lock was found to have been forcibly broken, indicating that unknown person(s) had gained unlawful entry into the premises by the use of force.

3. Upon further inspection of the premises, the following suspicious material was discovered:

- Two pairs of footwear (slippers/shoes) were found lying near the boundary/fence wall of the factory, suggesting that the intruders had used the fence wall as a point of entry or exit.
- Two (2) cartons of edible oil were found placed beside the fence wall near the said footwear. I wish to state that these cartons were NOT present at that location when the premises were locked the previous night. These cartons were part of the stock stored inside the locked factory gate, and their presence near the fence strongly suggests that the perpetrators had begun moving stolen goods out of the premises through the fence wall, but were possibly interrupted and abandoned the cartons before completing their escape.

4. Upon conducting a thorough check of the factory stock inside the gate whose lock had been broken, we discovered that several cartons of edible oil pouches were found to be missing from their designated storage area. Additionally, a number of cartons were found displaced and disturbed from their original organised arrangement, clearly indicating that the stock had been rummaged through and partially removed by the intruder(s). The exact number of missing cartons and their value is being ascertained and shall be provided to the investigation officer as a supplementary statement at the earliest.

5. I wish to state on record that the factory premises were fully secured and locked the previous night, with all stock organised and intact. The broken lock, the abandoned footwear, the displaced cartons, and the

missing stock are conclusive evidence of a deliberate and planned act of theft by house-breaking committed by unknown persons during the night.

6. The aforesaid acts of the unknown accused persons constitute cognisable offences, prima facie attracting provisions of **Section 303 (Theft), Section 331 (House-breaking), and other applicable provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.** and I request that an FIR be registered accordingly.

7. I, therefore, respectfully request your good office to:

- (i) Register a First Information Report (FIR) against unknown accused persons under the applicable sections of the BNS, 2023;
- (ii) Dispatch a police team to the factory premises at the earliest to inspect the scene of the crime, collect physical evidence including the broken lock, the abandoned footwear, and other clues, and preserve the integrity of the crime scene;
- (iii) Review CCTV footage, if available in the vicinity, to identify the perpetrators;
- (iv) Investigate the matter thoroughly and take appropriate legal action against the perpetrators to recover the stolen property and prevent recurrence.

I solemnly affirm that the contents of this complaint are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief, and nothing material has been concealed.
